

Meraux Foundation Commits \$250k To Community Center Of St. Bernard



Provides New Home for Local Food Pantry

The Arlene and Joseph Meraux Charitable Foundation announced today in a video message that it has committed \$250,000 to the Community

Center of St. Bernard, a charity that provides emergency food assistance to local families. Part of the donation establishes a new home for the food pantry at 7143 St. Claude Ave. in Arabi. The newly renovated building is more conveniently located, larger, and includes space for another nonprofit serving St. Bernard Parish as well.

"We are pleased to double down on our commitment to the Community Center, supporting the critical work it is doing to provide meals to local families in need," said Rita Gue, the president of the Meraux Foundation.

In addition to the new location, the Meraux Foundation's

"We are grateful for the Meraux Foundation's continued support, which is having a direct, positive impact on people's lives," said Jamie Hornberger, the Community Center's executive director. "Since the start of the pandemic and economic crisis, we've seen a spike in the number of families requiring food assistance. The Meraux Foundation immediately stepped up to help us meet this extraordinary need, and they continue to do so."

A year ago in March, the Meraux Foundation launched a COVID-19 grant program to support established 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations serving St. Bernard Parish. The first grant under the program more than doubled its annual commitment to the Community Center. This most recent commitment adds to that.

The Community Center's new location on St. Claude Ave. will be easy for its clients to access and, newly renovated, will provide an overall enhanced experience. The building includes additional space for another

Marker Commemorating Fazendeville To Be Dedicated April 16th

The St. Bernard Parish Government Office of Tourism and Film and the St. Bernard Parish Tourist Commission have worked collaboratively to produce a marker commemorating Fazendeville, the first known settlement established in St. Bernard Parish following the Civil War to house recently freed formerly enslaved people. The marker was funded by a grant from the St. Bernard Parish Tourist Commission. Fazendeville was located on the grounds of the Chalmette Battlefield, a unit of the Jean Lafitte National Historical Park in Chalmette, Louisiana. The dedication ceremony will take place along St. Bernard Highway in front of

the Chalmette Battlefield Friday, April 16th, 2021 at 10:30 am. The ceremony is free and open to the public.

The settlement was established by and named for Jean Pierre Fazende, Jr., a descendant of the free person of color community active in the business life of the New Orleans region before and after the Civil War. Fazende wanted to break the cycle of plantation life and dependence, recognizing that the transition from slavery to freedom was to be an arduous process. He subdivided the tract in 1867 – 1868. The Battleground Baptist Church was chartered in 1868 and by the 1870s, there was a general

store, school and a growing community of black people. Those who settled there became tradespeople and were highly respected for their integrity and strong work ethic. "Generations of the same families continued to inhabit the village until the Department of the Interior acquired the entire village through a variety of means, including exercising the "right of eminent domain" to expand the Chalmette Battlefield in 1964-65."

A reception will follow the dedication ceremony at the Aycock Street Barn, 409 Aycock Street, Arabi, Louisiana.



MADD Urges Passage of HB 633 Legislation to End Louisiana Road Fatalities

Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Louisiana is urging passage of a bill to reduce repeat drunk driving offenses by up to 70%. The legislation, HB 633 by Rep. Mark Wright, would change the way Louisiana uses in-vehicle technology to reform behavior around drunk driving and save lives.

HB 633 requires use of an in-car interlock device on first offense, a measure proven to reduce recidivism, and used in 34 other states and the District of Columbia. The device prevents drunk drivers from starting their cars. But the bill goes further, requiring interlock vendors to undergo more strict supervision, upgrade technology in Louisiana, and establish an indigency fund that reduces costs for those required to keep an interlock device in their vehicle after a DWI conviction.

"We know that the combination of supporting offenders with real resources to change their behaviors around drunk driving and holding the industry accountable has saved lives in other states. Many of the victim-survivors we support would not have lost their loved ones to drunk driving if this legislation were already enacted," said

Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Meghan Carter, director of Field Operations buisiana is urging passage of a bill to refor MADD Louisiana.

The bill's components were part of a set of recommendations on reducing road fatalities issued by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, to get Louisiana's astronomical rate of alcohol-related road deaths under control. FBI statistics show that by the time an offender is convicted once, they have typically driven drunk an average of 80 times.

"Drunk driving deaths are 100% preventable. We're taking our plea to legislators with smart reforms that ensure behaviors are changed after the first DWI," Carter said. "With increases in alcohol consumption during the pandemic shutdown, we know that drunk driving is bound to be an even bigger problem in the coming months and years. The time to take action is now."

The legislation:

- Provides a reduced rate for offenders determined to be indigent, through a vendor funded program with State Police investigated non-compliance
- Annual certification for devices, technicians and service centers

- Requires devices to meet newest National Highway Traffic Safety Administration Model Specs
- Requires annual inspections for service centers and testing for technicians
- Authorizes Louisiana State Police to enforce compliance
- Gives credit for time served in pretrial, bond or probation conditions
- Allows workers to return to work by striking current mandatory "hard" suspension times, with optional interlock terms

The bill will also enact data driven, proven methods to reduce recidivism by:


- Changing blood alcohol threshold for requiring and interlock from .20 to .15 matching 26 other states' laws
- Requiring research-based 180-day minimum interlock period on first offense
- Implementing interlock devices on hardship licenses and reinstatement for first offense
- Making suspension time equal to interlock term
- Instituting compliance-based removal and extended time for violations

SBA Raised Loan Limit For COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loans

SBA has raised the loan limit for COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loans to up to 24 months of economic injury with a maximum loan amount of \$500,000. Borrowers were sent an email about the new loan limit. Some borrowers are experiencing a technical issue when clicking on the email address to request a COVID-19 EIDL increase. When submitting the request, make sure to remove any additional characters that may appear in front of the email address so that your request can be delivered.



State Testing Begins In April

State testing will take place for St. Bernard Parish students throughout the months of April and May. Paper-based testing will be given to students in grades 3 and 4. Computer-based testing will be given to grades 5 - 8. High school students taking Algebra I, Geometry, English I, English II, Biology, and U.S. History will take the LEAP2025 assessment for each of these courses throughout the month of May.

For students in 3rd and 4th grade, testing will take place April 28 - 30 and May 3 - 4, 2021. Fifth grade students will be taking the English Language Arts and Mathematics tests May 10-12, 2021. These students will be taking the Science and Social Studies tests May 13, 14 and 17, 2021. Sixth through eighth grade students will be taking the English Language Arts and Mathematics tests May 4-6, 2021, Science, and Social Studies tests May 7 and May 10-11, 2021.


Students enrolled in state-approved home-study programs and students currently enrolled in private or parochial schools who plan to enter public schools next year for enrollment in grades 4 or 9 must register for this test. These students may participate in testing at their district public school during the scheduled testing sessions. Registration is required for participation. Registration forms may be completed at the St. Bernard Parish School Board Administration Office at 200 E. St. Bernard Highway until March 20, 2020. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday and 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. on Friday. Registration forms may be faxed upon request. The last day to register for state testing with your school district is April 12, 2021.

Printable registration forms, links to test information, and preparation materials are available on the St. Bernard Parish School Board website at www.sbpsb.org/testing.

Students currently enrolled in St. Bernard Parish public schools are not required to register for state testing.

Questions about testing and requests for registration forms can be directed to the District Testing Supervisor at 301-2000.

Understanding these worries, when the virus hit, my Medicare Advantage plan reached and let me know I could use telehealth to see my doctor, while socially isolating.

This included audio-only telehealth, which allowed me to talk to my doctors over the phone. Telehealth, both over the phone, and using video technology is really important, for seniors who don't have access the internet, or don't have a smartphone or computer.

As New Orleans slowly returns to normal, I want Senator Cassidy to know that Medicare Advantage took care of seniors like me who use it for their health care. I also ask him, and the other members of Congress from Louisiana to ensure that seniors like me continue to access telehealth, including over the phone.



St. Bernard Sheriff's Office Drug Take-Back Day Set For April 24

St. Bernard Parish Sheriff James Pohlmann encourages residents to properly dispose of unwanted or expired prescriptions and over-the-counter medications on Saturday, April 24 as the Sheriff's Office participates in the annual National Prescription Drug Take-Back.

Narcotics officers with the St. Bernard Sheriff's Office will accept unwanted medications from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Special Investigations Division substation, 7001 W. Judge Perez Drive in Arabi, near the corner of Aycock Street.

"Residents should take this opportunity to clean out their medicine cabinets and get rid of unused drugs so they don't fall into the hands of youngsters who might misuse them or thieves who could sell them on our streets," Sheriff Pohlmann said

The initiative, part of a national effort spearheaded by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration, has seen more than 4.8 million pounds of prescription drugs collected since its inception in 2010.

For those not able to make the April 24 event, the Sheriff's Office also has a drop box located year-round at the substation at 4700 Paris Road in Chalmette.

The drop box located at the Paris Road substation was installed as part of an initiative by state Attorney General Jeff Landry, Blue Cross Blue Shield and the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators. The goal of the initiative is to have a location in every Louisiana parish where residents can drop off unwanted medications at any time in an effort to fight the opioid epidemic.
