# St. Bernard Jury Convicts Hugh Gilliam

St. Bernard District Attorney, Perry Nicosia, announced that Hugh Gilliam, 32-year-old man, was convicted of Indecent Behavior with a Juvenile and Sexual Battery of a juvenile under the age of 13. The conviction was reached by a jury that deliberated about three hours on May 6, 2021. The trial lasted three days and was presided over by state District Judge Eric Bopp. The victim was a complete stranger to Gilliam.

Nicosia said, "The defendant

committed a reprehensible and Behavior with a Juvenile the terrifying assault on a vulnerable victim who had the courage to confront her attacker in court. The defendant has now been brought to justice and held accountable for his actions."

Gilliam faces up to a total of 124 years in prison. The sentence range under Louisiana law for Sexual Battery of a Juvenile under the age of 13 is 25 - 99 years in prison and for Indecent sentence range is 2 - 25 years. Gilliam is set for sentencing on June 22nd by Judge Bopp.

District Attorney Perry M. Nicosia commented after the trial, that "I'm pleased with the guilty verdicts on both counts handed down by the St. Bernard jurors. Our office will continue to work closely with the Sheriff's Office to ensure sexual predators and violent criminals are brought to

## **Sheriff's Office Searching For Suspects Responsible** For Dumping Barbed Wire In St. Bernard Parish Waters

The St. Bernard Sheriff's Office is seeking assistance from the public in locating and identifying suspects who are responsible for intentionally dumping barbed wire in St. Bernard Parish commercial and recreational fishing waters, Sheriff James Pohlmann said.

During the past two weeks, Sheriff Pohlmann said, the Sheriff's Office has received several reports from commercial fishermen who have had barbed wire become entangled in their nets and, in some instances, their boat motor propellers while trawling between Pointe Fortuna and the Mississippi River-Gulf Outlet Canal.

According to the fishermen. barbed wire getting caught in their nets and boat motor propellers can cause thousands of dollars in damage, and put their lives and livelihood at risk. If barbed wire gets wrapped around a motor propellor it can cause a boat to sink, and fishermen could be exposed to marine bacteria while trying to untangle the wire.

Sheriff Pohlmann warns individuals who are caught intentionally dumping barbed wire in any waterway in St. Bernard

The St. Bernard Sheriff's Office Addiction Resource Program helps residents struggling with an addiction, whether it be substance abuse, or even gambling related, find the resources they need to better cope with their situation. The program provides individuals and/or their families with information on resources available to them, such as rehabilitation programs, detox centers, therapeutic plans of action and faith-based assistance. ## Rental Assistance Available: Getting It And Keeping It Going



Survivors of hurricanes Laura, Delta and Zeta and the winter storms could be eligible for rental assistance for temporary housing through FEMA's Individuals and Households Program. FEMA pays rent, including a security deposit, at a place other than your damaged home.

Your rental can be a house, apartment or hotel that can keep you near your job, home, school and place of worship. The assistance includes essential utilities such as electricity and water but not cable or Internet.

The approved rental amount will be based on fair market rates for your area as determined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

To continue to receive rental assistance, you must prove an ongoing need, which may be that suitable housing is not available or that your permanent housing plan has not been completed through no fault of your own. If you intend to seek continued rental assistance, you'll need receipts to show you used the assistance for rent. Survivors should keep receipts for three years.

You may qualify for continued assistance if you:

- Demonstrate your disaster-related financial need; and
- Show you are developing a longer-term or permanent housing plan or demonstrate progress toward one. A contractor's estimate of repairs can point to progress.

A permanent housing plan is one that would put you back into permanent safe, sanitary and functional housing within a reasonable time. You must continue to work toward obtaining permanent housing to remain eligible for continued rental assistance.

If you have an ongoing need, you must ask for the help to continue. To do so:

- If you are a renter, contact FEMA and ask for a Declaration of Continuing Need for Rental Assistance.
- If you are a homeowner, the document is normally mailed to the rental-assistance recipient 15 days after the grant is approved.
- Return the form to FEMA by either mailing the completed form to: FEMA, P.O. Box 10055, Hyattsville MD 20782-8055, fax-

ing it to (800) 827-8112, or uploading it to your FEMA Disaster Assistance Center account, available online at DisasterAssistance.gov.

Extensions on rental assistance may be granted for three-month periods up to a maximum of 18 months from the date of the FEMA disaster declaration.

To be eligible for continued rental assistance, you must meet the following conditions:

- You were awarded initial rental assistance and used it as in-
- You are unable to return to your home because it cannot be accessed or is not suitable to live in due to the disaster.
- You do not have money for housing without assistance.
- You are not being given temporary housing help from any other
- You provide the status of your permanent housing plan.

The completed application will require these supporting docu-

- Pre-disaster and current household annual income.
- Copies of pre-disaster lease, utility bills, and renters insurance information.
- Copy of the lease or rental agreement signed by you and the landlord.
- Rental receipts, canceled checks or money orders showing the rental assistance was used to pay for housing expenses.

It is important to keep FEMA updated with your contact information and housing status.

# St. Bernard Sheriff's Office Holds D.A.R.E. Program Graduations

The intentional sabotaging of a commercial fishermen's livelihood will not be tolerated, the Sheriff said.

# **US Senator Bill Cassidy Meets With St. Bernard Parish Leaders**

Improving Hydrology, Securing Federal Support for Drainage Work, COVID-19 Relief Discussed

Prior to President Joe Biden's arrival in New Orleans, US Senator Bill Cassidy visited with St. Bernard Parish leaders in Chalmette on Thursday, May 10th to provide an update on what is happening on the federal level and to discuss local issues of importance.

In the meeting Parish President Guy McInnis stressed the importance of restoring water flow along the now dammed up Mississippi River Gulf Outlet and the critical need to receive federal support for drainage infrastructure work throughout St. Bernard Parish that was left over from Hurricane Katrina.

President McInnis expressed that rebuilding the parish's drainage system was an absolute necessity in order to protect the facilities, homes, and businesses that were rebuilt after Katrina.

The issue of federal support for small businesses struggling with related to COVID-19 was broached as well. Senator Cassidy conveyed that there's a deep divide in Washington as to the best way to transition the country's economy from the past year's COVID-19 shutdown to a post-pandemic society.

Senator Cassidy also talked about the status of the Reinvesting in America's Shoreline Economies and Ecosystems Act (RISEE) legislation he is cosponsoring with Sheldon Whitehouse of Rhode Island that would prevent GOMESA funds from sequestration and eliminate the state funding cap. GOMESA provides funding from off-shore oil and gas leases for coastal restoration projects.

Senator Cassidy expressed his hope that there will be bipartisan support for the legislation and that it would lead to greater and increased funding for critical work that will protect Louisiana's fragile coastline.





# National Hurricane Preparedness Week Is May 9th-May 15th

Take some time this week - Hurricane Preparedness Week - to make sure you have a hurricane evacuation plan. The first thing you need to do is find out if you live in a storm surge hurricane evacuation zone or if you're in a home that would be unsafe during a hurricane. If you are, figure out where you'd go and how you'd get there if told to evacuate. You do not need to travel hundreds of miles. Identify someone, perhaps a friend or relative who doesn't live in an evacuation zone or unsafe home, and coordinate with them to use their home as your evacuation destination. Be sure to account for your pets, as most local shelters do not permit them.
