SBEDF Announces St. Bernard Parish School Board's Approval of Chalmette Refining ITEP Application

School Board paves way for \$550m investment into Chalmette division of PBF Energy

The St. Bernard Economic Development Foundation (SBEDF) is proud to announce that St. Bernard Parish's School Board has officially approved Chalmette Refining's Industrial Tax Exemption Program (ITEP) application at the local level. The ITEP, a state incentive aimed at attracting investment in manufacturing, provides an 80% property tax abatement for an initial term of five years and the option to renew for five additional years at 80% property tax abatement on a manufacturer's qualifying capital investment re-

lated to the manufacturing process in Louisiana. With Sheriff James Pohlmann and Parish Council approving the exemption earlier this month, this is the first ITEP to receive local approval in St. Bernard Parish.

The proposed \$550 million investment, to be made to PBF Energy's existing Chalmette Refining facility, will serve as a top producer of biofuels and renewable diesel. The project involves retrofitting a refinery unit that has been idled since 2010, constructing a new pre-treatment unit, and making additions to docking, loading, offloading and tankage capabilities. The ITEP serves as a crucial role for attracting investment funds to

the St. Bernard project; there is hope that construction of the improvements to the facility could begin as early as this year, with plans to be fully operational by the end of 2022 or first quarter of 2023.

PBF Energy's Chalmette Refinery Manager Steve Krynski sees the exemption as an immense opportunity for the parish's community: "The Renewable Diesel Unit would put St. Bernard Parish at the forefront of the green energy transition bringing new full-time jobs to the refinery, new opportunities for local businesses, and new tax revenue to the parish. The

overwhelming excitement for this project from residents and officials from across St. Bernard Parish underscores just how woven Chalmette Refining is into the fabric of our local community - and why this is the ideal location for such an exciting 'green' investment." The project will directly add 20 new, permanent jobs in St. Bernard with an estimated payroll of \$1.4 million, and at least 92 indirect jobs and 600 jobs expected for construction. PBF Energy's Chalmette Refinery, built in 1915, is the largest private business taxpayer and employer in the parish and employs more than 500

Fighting for Vital Coastal Restoration Funding

Louisiana Lottery Launches Daily Numbers Game Pick 5

The Louisiana Lottery is adding a third game to its family of daily numbers games that currently includes Pick 3 and Pick 4. With a top prize of \$50,000, Pick 5 launched today with both favorite and brand-new play types.

"Our daily numbers game sales have shown solid, continual growth over the last several years with fiscal year sales up more than 21% over last year," noted Lottery President Rose Hudson. "We believe our daily numbers game players are ready for something new and more options to play their favorite number!"

As with Pick 3 and Pick 4, Pick 5 will be drawn daily except on Christmas Day and Easter Sunday. As the name suggests, a five-digit number is drawn. Players must match at least two of the digits in exact or any order to win a prize, depending upon the play type selected and the amount of the wager (50 cents or \$1).

Also, like Pick 3 and Pick 4, Pick 5 can be played Straight (all digits must match in exact order to win), Box (all digits must match in any order to win) or Straight/Box (combines a 50-cent straight play and a 50-cent box play). The top prize for a \$1 Straight play is \$50,000 or \$25,000 for a 50-cent Straight play with odds of 1 in 100,000.

In addition to these tried-and-true play types, the Lottery will introduce six new ways to play and win with Pick 5. Players will be able to match just the first or last two, three or four digits in the five-digit winning sequence to win. These new play types are called Front Pair, Back Pair, Front Three, Back Three, Front Four and Back Four. Prizes for these play types range from \$50 to \$5,000 for a \$1 wager; odds range from 1 in 100 to 1 in 10,000 respectively.

A complete list of prizes and odds for each play type and wager amount is available on the Pick 5 prize chart on the Lottery's website, louisianalottery.com/pick-5.

The Lottery reminds ticket purchasers to always play responsibly, encouraging anyone who has a gambling problem, or friends and family of anyone with a gambling problem, to call toll-free 1-877-770-7867 for help. Ticket purchasers must be at least 21 years of age. For security purposes, the Lottery strongly encourages players to sign the back of their tickets immediately after purchasing.




