Glass Half Full, Glass Recycling Company, Wins 7th Annual Startup St. Bernard



Glass Half Full, a glass recycling company that collects glass and converts it into

beach-like sand and glass cullet for disaster relief, eco-construction, new glass products, and

more was selected as the winner of the 7th annual Startup St. Bernard presented by the Meraux Foundation and St. Bernard Economic Development Foundation on Thursday. The startup took home the grand prize of nearly \$100K in cash and in-kind services.

"This is one of the most impressive groups of businesses we've ever had compete in Startup St. Bernard, and I'd like to congratulate Glass Half Full for taking home the grand

prize," said Rita Gue, the president of the Meraux Foundation. "Startup St. Bernard is all about showcasing our parish as a great place in which to do business, and all three of these companies are shining examples of the innovative and creative businesses that will thrive here."

Three finalists pitched their businesses in a "Shark Tank" style competition. The other two finalists, which each won \$5,000, were Nice Plants Good

St. Bernard Sheriff's Office Attends D.A.R.E. Conference, Wins Award

The St. Bernard Sheriff's Office participated in the 29th Annual State D.A.R.E. Training Conference held July 20-23 in Baton Rouge, Sheriff James Pohlmann said.

The Drug Abuse Resistance Education program coordinators, Capt. Lisa Jackson and Sgt. Darrin Miller, both of the Special Investigations Division, were among law enforcement officers, educators and government officials from across the state to attend the annual conference which consisted of various workshops focused on topics such as drug abuse prevention curriculum and en-

hancement lessons, vaping, online safety and over-the-counter medications.

The St. Bernard Sheriff's Office D.A.R.E. vehicle, a 2010 Ford F-150, was named the first place winner in the D.A.R.E. conference car show's Class 4 which include cars, trucks, recreational vehicles, boats, and motorcycles that are used for special occasions such as school functions and parades.

Sheriff Pohlmann said the D.A.R.E. anti-drug program, taught to fifth-graders in St. Bernard Parish schools by Capt. Jackson and Sgt. Miller, is aimed at discouraging young-

Meeting with the Morganza Action Coalition

I recently enjoyed catching up with members of the Morganza Action Coalition to talk about the importance of the Morganza-to-the-Gulf flood protection system. We discussed our recent victory in securing federal support for Morganza, which will not only provide much-needed flood protection in Southeast Louisiana, but will also protect the billions of dollars in economic activity transported through our region that provide valuable energy resources to fuel this country. Louisiana Lieutenant Governor Billy Nungesser and the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board crowned Mississippi Chef Austin Sumrall from White Pillars Restaurant in Biloxi, MS, as the 2021 King of American Seafood after winning the Great American Seafood Cook-Off on Saturday, August 7. The 17th annual event was held at the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center in New Orleans in conjunction with the Louisiana Restaurant Association Expo.

Chef Austin Sumrall prepared a Gulf Snapper Three Ways for the judges. "We took snapper and prepared it three different ways," said Mississippi Chef Austin Sumrall from White Pillars Restaurant in Biloxi. "We did a raw preparation. We grilled some snapper ribs. And, then we did a poached snapper jowl pho. It was a lot and we were down to the absolute wire on getting it accomplished but our plan was to go big or go home."

"We enjoy hosting the best chefs in the country to battle for the coveted title of King or Queen of American Seafood. Our congratulations to Mississippi chef Austin Sumrall for beating out a tough lineup of competitors to take home the crown 2021 King of American Seafood," said Louisiana Lt. Governor Billy Nungesser. "Beyond naming the best seafood chef in America, we also get to show off the exceptional quality of Gulf seafood and encourage the competitors to continue or start featuring our products in their restaurants. It truly is a

wonderful opportunity to further showcase to the nation all the things in Louisiana that will Feed Your Soul. We are already preparing for next year."

"Our restaurant is literally across the street from the Gulf of Mexico and every bit of seafood we serve is all gulf seafood because we feel like we would be cheating on the gulf if we didn't," said Mississippi Chef Austin Sumrall, 2021 King of American Seafood. "We have this awesome plethora of beautiful seafood that available to us and to be able to do something like this, we have a very seafood focused restaurant. Auburn, Alabama; and Chef Gena Berry, founder of Culinary Works providing food styling for motion pictures, network TV, and commercials.

Pots, a commercial plant nursery headquartered in Arabi, and St. Bernard EcoTourism, a local eco-tourism destination in St. Bernard for both tourists and locals alike.

"Startup St. Bernard is one of our best tools in promoting business attraction and growth in the parish. We cannot wait to see the services, jobs, and impacts Glass Half Full brings to our community in the coming years," said Meaghan McCormack, the Executive Director of the St. Bernard Economic Development Foundation.

Startup St. Bernard was open to any business under five years old that agreed to locate their base of operations in St. Bernard Parish and participate in its entrepreneurial ecosystem.

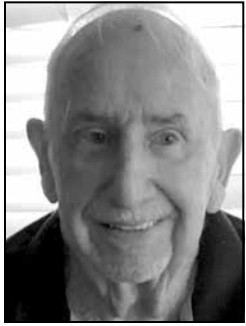
