# Meraux Foundation Establishes Hurricane Ida Recovery Program

Awards Grant to Irene Campbell Foundation

The Meraux Foundation has established the Hurricane Ida Recovery Program to address local community needs in the wake of the destructive Category 4 storm. Its first grant through the program was made to the Irene Campbell Foundation just days after the storm. The non-profit is managed by Eugene Campbell, who has been on the ground helping area residents impacted by hurricane.

"Eugene is a true servant leader, and we are proud to continue supporting his good work in our community," said Rita Gue, the president of the Meraux Foundation who advised Campbell to create his foundation and

was the first to fund it in May. "Many people in our community were impacted by the storm, including Eugene. But as is typical, he selflessly stepped up to help others."

The Meraux Foundation's grant to the Irene Campbell Foundation, in part, helped fund a food distribution on Sept. 4 organized by the St. Bernard Chamber of Commerce in partnership with the Irene Campbell Foundation and the Community Center of St. Bernard. # Helpful Info When Appealing a Decision from FEMA

You applied to FEMA for disaster assistance after Hurricane Ida hit and you received a letter. You're not sure what it says, but you think it's not good.

Often, these letters are sent when your application is missing information. Maybe you didn't show proof you are who you say you are, proof you own your home, or proof you lived in your home for a major part of the year before Ida. Here are tips for writing a letter to appeal a FEMA decision.



#### **Opposing Speaker Pelosi's Radical Energy Tax**

I offered an amendment to Speaker Pelosi's massive \$3.5 trillion "reconciliation" bill that would prevent the energy tax in the bill from going into effect until the Environmental Protection Agency can ensure that it won't cause increased health care costs. This vote was taken in my committee, the Energy and Commerce Committee, and Democrats on the committee defended the tax and blocked my amendment.

This radical new tax will raise electricity costs on hard-working families by more than 12%, and directly violates President Biden's promise not to increase taxes on families making less than \$400,000 as well as his promise to lower health care costs. America's hospitals and families shouldn't have to suffer the consequences of Washington liberals' radical Green New Deal policies that will cause their health care and energy costs to skyrocket. This new tax will negatively impact our hospitals which are already stretched thin as they respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, and will raise health care costs on families who are already experiencing the inflationary sticker shock from President Biden's wasteful spending bills that already are hitting their pocket books.

This tax also aims to destroy America's oil and gas industry, and will certainly raise energy costs for American families above the skyrocketing increases they're already paying. We should be focusing on smart policies that increase American energy production so that families don't get saddled with higher utility costs and our hospitals are equipped to better serve our communities.

**Meeting With HUD Secretary Marcia Fudge** 

I met with Housing and Urban Development Secretary Marcia Fudge, Congressman Troy Carter, and state and local officials in Jefferson Parish to discuss disaster relief for Hurricane Ida victims, including temporary housing options for displaced residents. We also discussed how we can cut red tape to get people back in their homes as quickly as possible.

#### **Urging FEMA to Delay NFIP Rate Hikes**

Congressman Garret Graves and I wrote a letter to Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Administrator Deanne Criswell urging her to delay FEMA's Risk Rating 2.0 policy, which would cause National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) rates to skyrocket for policyholders who play by the rules.

The devastation caused by Hurricane Ida and the long road to recovery in its aftermath have placed difficult burdens on Louisiana families as we work to rebuild. With communities continuing to recover, it would be devastating for FEMA to enforce Risk Rating 2.0. We must continue working to implement long-term reforms to the NFIP to ensure the program remains affordable and stable for the future.

#### **Touring Hurricane Ida Damage**

I toured damage from Hurricane Ida in Kenner with Mayor Ben Zahn. Kenner was hit hard by Ida, and I'll continue to work with Mayor Zahn and our local leaders to help our communities recover in the aftermath of the storm. For many families, it will be a long road to recovery, but Louisianans are resilient, and we'll get through this together.

## **NOAA Restore Science Program Awards USM Professor** With Funding For Chandeleur Islands Restoration Planning



## THE WATER INSTITUTE OF THE GULF®

The Water Institute of the Gulf researchers will join in a project funded by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) RESTORE Science Program to examine how to maximize benefits of restoring and managing the Chandeleur Islands in the northern Gulf of Mexico, particularly as it relates to the unique seagrass ecosystems along the islands.

Led by Dr. Kelly Darnell, a University of Southern Mississippi (USM) assistant research professor, the project is funded by the NOAA RESTORE Science Program, with an award amount of \$127,065. It is one of 20 projects that were awarded a combined \$2.3 million to collaboratively scope and design research that will inform future decisions on how to manage natural resources in the Gulf of Mexico region, including marine mammals, shorebirds, barrier islands, seagrass, and fisheries. Each project, slated to begin this month, is designed to

applied science, and ultimately, the sustainability of the Gulf of Mexico ecosystem.

"Our project team brings together experts in island geomorphology, seagrass biology and ecology, and approaches to building resilience with managers from state and federal agencies to tackle important questions for maximizing restoration of the Chandeleur Islands," Darnell said. "We're committed to developing a plan that provides practical and useable data that can be easily incorporated into restoration and management decisions for the unique and productive Chandeleur Islands."

Damaged in the 2010 Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill, the Chandeleur Islands are hotspot in the northern Gulf of Mexico for fish and wildlife while also providing storm protection to coastal Louisiana. The islands are the only location of seagrasses in Louisiana and

be an investment in the future of contain all five of the seagrass species that occur in the northern Gulf of Mexico.

> "These seagrass beds are very dynamic and have greatly reduced with major storms, such as Katrina in 2005. This project will help understand how decisions made in planning the Chandeleur Islands restoration may influence the area of seagrass potentially growing in future decades," said Tim Carruthers, Director of Coastal Ecology at The Water Institute of the Gulf.

> This project, which is a collaboration between natural resource managers and researchers, will develop a plan to answer questions about seagrasses and their associated communities and provide useable data that will inform restoration and long-term management of the islands.

"The Chandeleur Islands are





a highly dynamic system, and the long-term health of the seagrass meadows and other habitats is tied to them being resilient to storms and sea level rise even as the islands themselves evolve on a daily and weekly basis," said Soupy Dalyander, Senior Research Scientist at The Water Institute of the Gulf.

Darnell, who also serves as the director of the Mississippi Based RESTORE Act Center of Excellence and is an assistant research professor in USM's Division of Coastal Sciences at the Gulf Coast Research Lab in Ocean Springs, is joined by the Water Institute of the Gulf, University of Florida, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and Gulf of Mexico

Alliance in collaborating on this project.

"The NOAA RESTORE Science Program aims to fund research that reduces the uncertainty around the management of natural resources in the Gulf of Mexico region," said Julien Lartigue, director of the Science Program. "The team of resource managers and researchers that Dr. Darnell has assembled will work together to explore the dynamics of seagrass beds near the Chandeleur Islands and design a research plan that will provide the information we need to effectively manage and restore this important habitat. The team submitted a competitive proposal, and we are looking forward to working with them on this award."

#### **APPEALING FEMA** from Page 1

#### You Have 60 Days to Send FEMA Your Appeal.

The most important part of the appeal process is knowing how long you have to do something about it. Count 60 days from the date FEMA has on the determination letter. That's the date you'll circle on your calendar to remind you it's the last day to send FEMA your appeal. Keep in mind that after FEMA receives your letter, you may receive a phone call or a follow-up letter asking for more information.

#### Carefully Read FEMA's Letter Before Writing Your Appeal.

You'll need to understand why FEMA said the application was "ineligible," or that assistance to you is denied, or that FEMA is holding off on making a decision. Often, the reason is as simple as missing documents or information. Read FEMA's letter from beginning to end to help you understand what the agency is asking you to do.

#### **Include Evidence to Support Your Appeal Request**

Your appeal letter is not enough to get FEMA to reconsider its decision. You need evidence to support what you are claiming in your appeal. It is important to include the documents or informa-

tion FEMA requests. Here's what to include with your letter:

A copy of the FEMA letter saying you're denied assistance, or that the agency didn't reach a decision.

**Insurance letters:** Your insurance company might give you just a fraction of what you need to repair your home, not enough to help you get into another place, or not enough to replace certain belongings. Keep in mind that FEMA cannot give you a grant for something your insurance company already paid you for.

**Proof of occupancy:** A copy of a utility bill, a driver's license, a lease or bank statement, a local school document, motor vehicle registration or an employer's letter. All can be used to prove the damaged home or rental was your primary residence. Primary meaning you lived there during a major part of the year.

**Proof of ownership:** Mortgage or insurance documents; tax receipts or a deed; receipts for major repairs or improvements dating as far back as 2016; a mobile home park letter or a court document. If your documents were lost or destroyed, click on usa.gov/replace-vital-documents for information on how to replace them.

## Mail, Fax or Upload Your Appeal Letter, Don't Forget to Sign and Date It

You have 60 days from the date on your FEMA determination letter to mail, fax or upload your appeal if you want FEMA to reconsider their first decision. Sign and date your appeal. And don't forget to include your nine-digit FEMA application number, your disaster number (DR-4611-LA), and documents you can show as proof. o Mail: FEMA National Processing Service Center, P.O. Box 10055, Hyattsville, MD 20782-8055

- To set up a FEMA online account or to upload documents online, go to <u>www.DisasterAssistance.gov</u>, click on "Check Status" and follow the directions

#### **What You Can Expect After Submitting Your Appeal Letter**

You've written your appeal and sent it to FEMA within 60 days after you received their determination letter. Now what? You may receive a call or letter from FEMA asking for more information. Or FEMA may schedule another inspection of your primary home. Whichever the case, once you've sent FEMA an appeal, you can expect a decision letter within 90 days after FEMA receives it.

Reminders:

- The deadline to apply for FEMA disaster assistance is Thursday, Oct. 28.
- For any questions, call the FEMA Helpline at 800-621-3362 (TTY 800-462-7585) The lines are open 24 hours, 7 days a week. If you use a relay service such as a videophone, Inno-Caption or CapTel, give FEMA your specific phone number assigned to that service. Operators can also connect you to a specialist who speaks your language.



aux Foundation who advised Campbell to create his foundation and was the first to fund it in May. "Many people in our community were impacted by the storm, including Eugene. But as is typical, he selflessly stepped up to help others."

Through its Hurricane Ida Recovery Program, the Meraux Foundation is monitoring the situation to identify critical needs so that its funds have the greatest impact. It is not accepting proposals or solicitations for grants and is only funding existing 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations serving St. Bernard Parish.

## **St. Bernard Sheriff's Office Searching For Persons Of Interest In Connection With Armed Robbery In Chalmette**

The St. Bernard Sheriff's Office is seeking assistance from the public in locating and identifying two persons of interest who may have been involved in an armed robbery that occurred on Tuesday, Sept. 7 in Chalmette, Sheriff James Pohlmann said.

Shortly before 9 p.m. on Sept. 7, Sheriff Pohlmann said, deputies received a call for service from

two male victims who said they were robbed at gunpoint in the parking lot of a business in the 9000 block of West Judge Perez

When deputies arrived on the scene, they were met by the two victims who said three black males in an older model, dark-colored Chevrolet Suburban parked next to them, exited the vehicle, brandished weapons and demanded their belongings.

The suspects then fled the scene in an unknown direction.

During the altercation, one of the male victims, a 16-year-old, was struck with a firearm and suffered a laceration to the head. Sheriff Pohlmann said no one else was injured in the incident.





## **Nungesser Welcomes Students At | KIWANIS KORNER The Louisiana School For The Deaf And Visually Impaired**

Lt. Governor Billy Nungesser, Volunteer Louisiana Executive Director Judd Jeansonne, and Superintendent Ernest Garrett of the Louisiana School for the Deaf & Visually Impaired (LSDVI) invited over 70 students in the 8th through 12th grade to participate in the launch of the "Distinction for Community Service" diploma endorsement program at the school. Students who perform 80 hours of community service during their high school years may earn this seal on their diploma. LSDVI is located in Baton Rouge and Special School Programs with residential students from across the state. Lt. Governor Nungesser administers the Volunteer Louisiana program currently providing over 1,700 volunteers involved with hurricane disaster relief in state, and efforts with over 10,000 volunteers from faith-based and non-profit organizations.

The Louisiana Schools for the Deaf and Visually Impaired have been in existence since 1852. There is a long history of the two schools starting out together, separating and coming back together in 2009 at the property on Brightside Dr. In 1977, the Special School was created in law to oversee the Louisiana Special Schools and Special School Programs.

The Special School District offers educational services to students with low-incidence disabilities from across the state. The District is comprised of two residential schools, the Louisiana School for the Deaf and the Louisiana School for the Visually Impaired (LSDVI), located in Baton Rouge and Special School Programs, which are schools located in correctional, mental and behavioral health facilities across the state where special education services are offered to qualified students.
