St. Bernard Sheriff's Office Seeking Two Men In Connection With Armed Robbery

The St. Bernard Sheriff's Office has issued an arrest warrant for a New Orleans man and named another man a person of interest in connection with a

recent armed robbery in Arabi, Sheriff James Pohlmann said.

Mitchell Craft, 39, of the 200 block of Maumus Street in New Orleans, is wanted in connection



with the armed robbery which occurred Sept. 11 on Lebeau Street in Arabi.

Another man has been named

a person of interest in the incident and is wanted for questioning. He is a black male with a slender build and short, cropped hair.

The Sheriff's Office is seeking assistance from the public in locating Craft and identifying the person of interest.

On Sept. 11, shortly before midnight, Sheriff Pohlmann said, deputies responded to a call for service in reference to an armed robbery that occurred in the 1000 block of Lebeau Street.

When deputies arrived on the scene they were met by a male victim who said he was followed by a man, later identified as Craft, from a business in Kenner

Resuming Energy Lease Sales in the Gulf of Mexico

The U.S. Interior Department announced that it is moving ahead with a previously-canceled lease sale in the Gulf of Mexico. The bids will be announced on November 17, 2021.

I'm happy to see the Biden Administration come to grips with the reality that they don't have the authority to ban oil and gas leasing in the Gulf of Mexico, and I thank Louisiana Attorney General Jeff Landry for filing the lawsuit that ultimately led to this illegal ban being overruled. This lease sale will bring critical dollars to Louisiana for coastal restoration and flood protection.

The Biden Administration needs to abandon the radical Green New Deal and recognize that the vast majority of American families support an all-of-the-above energy strategy that promotes responsible energy exploration and development focused on lower costs and more energy security.

Tax-and-Spending Spree is Bad for Louisiana

I co-authored an op-ed in The Advocate with Senator John Kennedy and Representatives Garret Graves, Clay Higgins, Mike Johnson, and Julia Letlow explaining our opposition to Congressional Democrats' linked \$5.5 trillion infrastructure and reconciliation package currently under consideration in the U.S. House

of Representatives. This socialist grab bag enhances President Biden's reckless agenda through massive new spending, Green New Deal policies, and large tax increases that would decimate families, workers, and small businesses.

Multi-Parish Burn Ban Updated Following Hurricane Ida

As recovery efforts progress following the devastation caused by Hurricane Ida, State Fire Marshal H. "Butch" Browning and Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain are lifting the cease and desist order issued for all private burning, pursuant to authority under R.S. 40:1602, for the following parishes: Iberville and St. Bernard.

The cease and desist order remains in place for Jefferson, Lafourche, Orleans, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, and Terrebonne parishes. In these parishes, private burning shall only be allowed by permission of the local fire department or local government. This revised order is effective as of 5 p.m., September 27, 2021, and shall remain in effect until rescinded.

This ban shall not apply to prescribed burns by the Department of Agriculture and Forestry, by those trained and certified by the Department of Agriculture and Forestry, by those who conduct prescribed burning as a "generally accepted agriculture practice" as defined by the Louisiana Right to Farm Law (R.S. 3:3601 et seq.), or as permitted by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality.

Violation of this Fire Marshal order could result in criminal and/ or civil penalties.

Where the burn ban is being lifted, the SFM would like remind residents that the only legal items you can burn in Louisiana are vegetation and ordinary yard waste items like leaves, tree branches, grass clippings, etc.

According to the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, items NOT allowed to be burned include:

- Plastic and other synthetic materials
- Tires and other rubber products
- Paints, household and agricultural chemicals
- Asphalt shingles, heavy oils, wire
- Newspaper, cardboard and other paper products
- Buildings and mobile homes

FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers Are Open

FEMA/State Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs) are open in 16 locations throughout SE Louisiana hit hard by Hurricane Ida. New centers are opening daily and the DRCs are a great resource for people needing face to face assistance in navigating through the disaster assistance process.

Suspect Identified, Arrested In New Orleans Grocery Fire

A man wanted in connection with a July grocery store fire in the French Quarter of New Orleans has been arrested in the case.

Thomas Patterson, 31, was booked into the Orleans Parish Prison on Sept. 23 on one count of Aggravated Arson and several other charges from another agency.

Around 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, July 6, the New Orleans Fire Department responded to a call for a fire inside of the Rouses grocery store located in the 700 block of Royal Street. The fire was contained to a shelf of paper towels. Another customer quickly extinguished the fire with a jug of water.

Despite the store being occupied by staff and several customers at the time of the fire, there were no injuries reported.

Following an assessment of the scene, including obtaining video evidence, deputies determined the fire was intentionally set and began trying to identify a person of interest. During the investigation, it was determined that the New Orleans Police Department was also trying to identify the same individual for additional crimes in the area.

With help from the public, the SFM and NOPD were able to confirm Patterson as the suspect in several cases.

On Sept. 23, Patterson was located by NOPD officers and taken into custody.

The SFM would like to thank NOPD for their partnership in closing these cases.






