Chalmette High School Football Coach Jason Tucker Secures Record for All-Time Wins

It was a big win for the Chalmette Owls on Friday night. The football team went undefeated in district play, clinching the district championship, and Coach Jason Tucker cemented his legacy, becoming the school's alltime winningest coach. With the victory over Riverdale, Tucker passes Bobby Nuss whose record stood for more than four decades.

Tucker, a graduate and former football standout for the Owls, said he bleeds maroon and

"To be a part of the same program that helped mold me is truly humbling," Tucker said.

A 26-year veteran of the high school coaching circuit, Tucker has led the Owls since 2007. He called his latest victory a special one. "Any time your name is mentioned in the same breath as a great coach like Bobby Nuss, you feel nothing but pride."

He credits his coaching staff for the program's continued success.

"The consistency of our coaching staff makes the biggest difference of all. It is the backbone of our football program."

Tucker said his coaching focus is on accountability and communication.

"It's important that our players understand that we need them to be good citizens and that representing our school on the field is an honor they must earn," he said. "Our players hear

Blasting Congressional Democrats' Radical Tax-and-Spending Spree

Instead of calling on greater energy production from Saudi Arabia and other OPEC countries that emit more carbon to make the same things, President Biden should support American energy production and manufacturing.

It is also important for our state to continue producing energy in the Gulf of Mexico, which not only helps to heat homes across America, but also funds hundreds of millions of dollars in coastal restoration work and hurricane protection projects that are critical to our state through revenue sharing.

We also discussed my bipartisan Secure Equipment Act, which prevents China from infiltrating America's telecommunications network and compromising our national security. This bill, which passed the Senate unanimously and now heads to the President's desk to be signed into law, forcefully signals to the Chinese Communist Party that America is committed to protecting the privacy and security of our citizens. I also emphasized that Congress needs to work together to pass more meaningful, bipartisan legislation that benefits and protects Americans from enemies seeking to do us harm.

Secretary Ardoin Announces The Addition Of Old Governor's Mansion To The Department Of State's Museum Division


Louisiana Secretary of State State's office is tasked with the Kyle Ardoin is pleased to announce the addition of the Louisiana Old Governor's Mansion in Downtown Baton Rouge to the Museum Division operated by the Louisiana Department of State. The historic Old Governor's Mansion (OGM) was formerly operated under the purview of the Governor's Office by the Louisiana Division of Administration (the Division) through a cooperative endeavor agreement (CEA) with the Foundation for Historical Louisiana, Inc. (FHL).

"The Louisiana Secretary of

guardianship and preservation of our state's unique history," said Ardoin. "These educational and historic properties include the Old State Capitol, State Archives and seven other signature facilities that operate throughout the state as the Louisiana State Museum Division of the Louisiana Department of State. I am excited about the addition of the Old Governor's Mansion, which complements and accentuates the mission of the Old State Capitol, providing visitors and event-goers a tangible opportunity to experience

our history first hand."

The Louisiana Division of Administration entered into an interagency agreement with the Department of State to take control of the facility in July 2021. On October 26, 2021, the Division terminated the relationship with FHL, notified the Secretary of State of this development and provided representatives of the Department of State access to the facility for the first time on November 1, 2021
