UCA Regionals Competition the following day at Southeastern University in Hammond.



Nunez, Northshore Community Colleges Sign Articulation Agreement



Chancellors for Nunez Community College and Northshore Technical Community College signed a memorandum of understanding Dec. 14 that will allow Nunez students to complete Maritime and Drafting degrees at Northshore, while Northshore students can complete Aerospace Manufacturing and Process Technology degrees at Nunez. Nunez Community College and Northshore Technical Community College signed an articulation agreement Dec. 14 that will allow students from each college to complete popular degree programs unique to the other college's programs of study.

The memorandum of understanding signed by Nunez Chancellor Dr. Tina Tinney and Northshore Chancellor Dr. William Wainwright allows for Nunez students to complete their first year of college on the Nunez campus before transferring to Northshore to complete a degree program in either Maritime or Drafting. Students at Northshore can complete their first year at one of Northshore's campuses before transferring to Nunez to complete a degree in either Aerospace Manufacturing or Process Technology.

"This MOU will strengthen workforce pathways. Dr. Wainwright and I have a long history of working together to leverage partnerships," said Dr. Tinney, who worked in administration at Northshore prior to becoming Chancellor at Nunez. "Students can spend one

CBP, Carnival Cruise Line Introduces Facial Biometrics At Port Of New Orleans

U.S. Customs and Border guired to provide biometrics Protection (CBP), in partnership with Carnival Cruise Line, expanded the use of facial biometrics into the debarkation process at the Port of New Orleans, becoming the latest seaport to modernize efforts to revolutionize cruise travel.

"As cruise travel resumes around our nation's ports, CBP is working closely with the cruise industry to make travel safer and more efficient, while also supporting travel recovery efforts," said Steven Stavinoha, Director, Field Operations for CBP's Gulf Coast Field Office. "The biometric facial comparison process adds an extra layer of security and streamlines travel into the United States by replacing the manual inspection of travel documents with a secure, touchless process."

This innovative entry process further secures and enhances the customer experience while protecting the privacy of all travelers. The enhanced arrival process using facial biometrics verifies the traveler's identity within two seconds and is more than 98% accurate. When debarking the cruise vessel at a U.S. seaport, passengers will pause for a photo that will be compared to the traveler's existing passport or visa photo in secure DHS systems to biometrically verify their identity. Upon an efficient match, passengers collect their baggage, proceed through inspections and exit the terminal.

U.S. travelers and select foreign nationals who are not reand wish to opt out of the new biometric process can simply request a manual document check from a CBP Officer consistent with existing requirements for admission into the United States.

Already in use at major air and land ports of entry, facial biometrics in the cruise environment will strengthen CBP's enforcement capabilities at several of the nation's cruise ports while also enhancing the customer experience. Additionally, CBP and its cruise partners have expanded data sharing agreements to further strengthen security in cruise travel.

To date, facial biometric comparison technology is available at 12 seaports across the United States and has been successfully used to process arriving passengers on cruise vessels in Florida, New Jersey, Texas, California, Washington, and now Louisiana.

Currently, more than 119 million travelers have participated in the biometric facial comparison process at air, land, and sea ports of entry. Since September 2018, CBP has leveraged facial biometrics to prevent more than 1,100 impostors using genuine travel documents from illegally entering the United States at air and land Ports of Entry. The Battle of Lake Borgne was the first military engagement in the British campaign for New Orleans culminating in the Battle of New Orleans, January 8th, 1815. A British amphibious force consisting of shallow-draft vessels with canons defeated the American naval force after very fierce, bloody, hand-to-hand combat. Despite the American loss, the engagement alerted American military forces that the British had arrived in Louisiana waters and that the British land invasion was imminent. Louisianans organized a successful defense of New Orleans which secured American ownership of the Mississippi Valley.

year at Nunez preparing for a Maritime or Drafting degree, which provides critical workforce in serving industry in our region, before transferring to Northshore to complete the program in the subsequent year.

"People in our community often ask, 'When is Nunez going to offer maritime?' And Dr. Wainwright has shared that he is frequently asked about offering Aerospace and PTEC. This is a strategic alliance that offers access by leveraging resources, not duplicating them."

Dr. Wainwright added, "This is bigger than just efficiencies. It's also about local and regional economies."

Dr. Daniel Roberts, Northshore Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, noted that articulation agreements between community colleges are rare, but noted that the arrangement will expand opportunities to students at both colleges.

Chalmette, was booked Dec. 15 with possession with intent to distribute cocaine, possession with intent to distribute fentanyl, possession of a firearm while in possession of a controlled dangerous substance and possession of marijuana.

After obtaining information that Raines was involved in illegal drug activity in St. Bernard, Narcotics Unit agents opened an investigation. Based on their findings, agents obtained several search warrants in the case, Sheriff Pohlmann said.

During the investigation, agents recovered 29 grams of cocaine and fentanyl with an estimated street value of \$2,900; 44 grams of cocaine and fentanyl with an estimated street value of \$4,400;

marijuana, digital scales and clear plastic packaging bags.

Agents also recovered \$10,247 in cash, as well as a loaded .9mm Ruger handgun and a Springfield .45 caliber semi-automatic handgun.

All three subjects were transported to St. Bernard Parish Prison to be booked on the above charges.

Sheriff Pohlmann reminds residents to call the Sheriff's Office narcotics hotline at (504) 271-DOPE or 3673 to report suspected illegal drug activity in St. Bernard Parish. Callers can remain anonymous, and all calls will be acted upon.





Beware of Scam and Fraud This Holiday Season





Don't let a fraud or scam steal the joy of the holiday season from you. Be aware that con artists and criminals may try to steal money or personal information from you through fraud, scams or identity theft. Some may even pose as federal disaster workers.

If a person approaches you as a FEMA employee, always ask to see their badge. All FEMA representatives carry an identification badge with a photograph. A FEMA shirt or jacket is not proof of identity.

FEMA representatives do not ask for money from disaster survivors, or for payment for any services. They do not ask

for information during unsolicited telephone calls or through email. FEMA will not contact you unless you have called FEMA first or applied for assistance.

FEMA representatives will ask for social security and bank account numbers when you apply for assistance and may ask for it again after you apply. Be cautious when giving this information to others who ask for it. Scam artists may pose as government officials, aid workers, or insurance company employees.

Other types of fraud which you may experience after a disaster:

- Phony property inspections or inspectors: FEMA inspectors will never ask for your registration number. No government disaster assistance official will call you to ask for your financial account information. If you doubt a FEMA representative is legitimate, hang up and call the FEMA Helpline at 800-621-3362 to report the incident.
- Phony building contractors: FEMA does not hire or endorse specific contractors to fix homes or recommend repairs. A FEMA housing inspector's job is to verify damage. Always hire a reputable engineer, architect or

your home. An unethical contractor may create damage to get work.
